Attendance

Enrichment

At Crispin, we believe that learning goes beyond the classroom. Enrichment activities give students the chance to explore new interests, develop skills, and build confidence.

- Years 7 & 8: Students are expected to take part in at least two enrichment activities this
 year.
- Year 9: Students are expected to take part in at least one enrichment activity.

A full programme of opportunities, along with details on how to sign up, will be shared by Miss Horne next week. We strongly encourage all students to take advantage of these experiences, as they are an important part of school life and personal development.

Uniform

- White socks are not permitted.
- Hoodies, hats, and additional jewellery will be confiscated at the school gate.
- Confiscated items are kept in Student Reception until the end of the day.
- Repeat offences will require parents/carers to collect items.
- Year 7 Students should wear their full PE kit to school on the days they have PE.

Mobile Devices

- Phones must be switched off and stored in bags throughout the school day.
- Any phone used without permission will be confiscated.
- Confiscated phones can be collected from Student Reception at the end of the day.
- Repeat offences will require parents/carers to collect items.
