# Message from Mr Cornwall, Acting Headteacher

## **Head Student Speech**

My name is Mackenzie and I am one of the Head Students here at Crispin. First of all, let me say how great is to see so many young people at tonight's open evening. Although I was in Year 6 over 5 years ago, I can still clearly remember how anxious I felt, and I imagine you feel the same right now. I know it must seem like a big step choosing your school and going into Year 7, and it is a big leap, but trust me when I say, it's also the start of something amazing. And today I would like to share with you why I think this school is such an incredible place to be. And no, I am not saying that because the teachers are watching me right now.

There are lots of amazing things at this school that I could talk about, but unfortunately, I don't have enough time to tell you all of them, however I can tell you about what I believe are the best parts of Crispin. As a year 11 who is undergoing my GCSEs in nine months, I cannot emphasise enough to you how supportive the teachers here really are. You wouldn't believe how much time and effort they put into giving the students here the best education possible, some of them spend so much time here, it wouldn't surprise me if they lived on site!

And if you have spent as much time as I have here, you really come to appreciate how much they do for the pupils. I have been lucky enough to have the same tutor for 5 years and she has been so helpful and kind, I cannot thank her enough.

The whole idea of a tutor isn't to just run these sessions, but to help you as an individual, succeed in school and give you support in many areas such as learning in lessons or welfare, or even in my case, ordering extra decks of cards.

Looking back on year 7, one of the most exciting elements of joining here, was the amount of freedom you are given. 
**Year 7** - If they have a PE lesson 1-4, they must change back into their uniforms.

**Year 7** - students must be wearing Crispin branded PE kit and not merely a black jumper for example.


**ALL YEARS** - If students have PE during period 5, they can remain in their PE kits to go home in, but this must be their PE kit.

**ALL YEARS** - students require a gumshield, shin pads and plastic studded boots for activities such as Hockey, Football and Rugby






