Thank you to staff that wore yellow in support of World Mental Health Day.






















# Year 8 Lulworth Cove Trip

Our Year 8 student, Henry, plays for Bath RFC.


Henry along with several other Crispin students (who play for Castle Cary RFC), played in the North Dorset Rugby Football Club (NDRFC) tournament.
