Crispin Remembers

Why Somerset Remembers

This week students and staff at Crispin marked Remembrance 2025, honouring the sacrifices made by generations of servicemen and women from our local community and beyond.

This year's theme, "Why Should Somerset Remember?", was explored across year-group assemblies, where students learned about remarkable local figures who served with courage. These included Second Lieutenant John Alexander Hellard, who fell on the second day of the Battle of the Somme in 1916; Captain William Williams, a US pilot based in Somerset who died during an anti-submarine operation in 1942; Odette Hallowes, an SOE agent who showed extraordinary bravery in occupied France; and Warrant Officer Class 1 Matt Tomlinson, a former Crispin student honoured for his gallantry in Iraq and Afghanistan. Their stories highlighted the enduring connections between Somerset and the events of global conflict.

Our School Act of Remembrance

At 10:50 on Tuesday 11 November, members of the Cadets formed up outside the hall and marched through the school, led smartly by Coby Patey. They took their position by the remembrance tree, where the wreath would later be laid.

During the service, Lian Bonehill read the poignant poem 'On Flanders Field', reminding everyone of the voices of those who served and the importance of carrying their memory forward. The service concluded with the laying of the wreath by Holly Whitcombe, a symbolic gesture of respect on behalf of the entire Crispin community.

This year's Remembrance event encouraged students not only to look back at the past, but also to reflect on how local stories of bravery, loss and resilience continue to shape our present. As we honoured those who served, we strengthened our understanding of why remembrance matters - for Somerset, for our school, and for the future.

















Why Attendance Matters

Every Day Counts

Excellent school attendance is one of the most important factors in ensuring a child's academic success, wellbeing, and future opportunities. At Crispin School, we are committed to working in partnership with families to support excellent attendance, as it has a direct and lasting impact on your child's learning.

The Link Between Attendance and Achievement

Missing school-whether a single day or frequent short absences-adds up quickly. Just a few days of absence can lead to gaps in learning, making it harder for students to keep up with work, feel confident in lessons, and achieve their full potential. National research shows that:

- Students who attend **96% or above** are significantly more likely to achieve strong academic outcomes.
- Missing just 1 day every 2 weeks adds up to 19 days of learning lost in a year-almost a full month of school.
- Regular routines lead to better progress, improved confidence, and stronger social relationships.

Attendance and Wellbeing Go Hand in Hand

Consistent attendance supports more than academic success-it builds social confidence, resilience, and positive mental wellbeing. Students who attend regularly:

- Form stronger friendships and feel more connected to school life
- Build good habits around responsibility, timekeeping, and organisation
- Are more likely to participate in clubs, trips, leadership roles, and enrichment opportunities

How You Can Support Good Attendance

We understand that occasionally children will be unwell and unable to attend. However, there are steps parents can take to help keep attendance strong:


- Aim for medical and dental appointments outside of school hours
- Establish a consistent morning and bedtime routine
- Encourage attendance even when your child feels a little tired or "not in the mood"
- Communicate with us early if there are barriers to attendance-we are here to help

At lunch time, there will be activities in the hall led by Mr. Priddice (Head of Curriculum for Life) with some freebies!



Online Safety & Social Media

Children today live much of their lives online - social media, messaging apps, and gaming are central to how they connect with friends. While these platforms can be positive, they also bring risks such as cyberbullying, unsafe contact, misinformation, and inappropriate content. Increasingly, young people are also exposed to Al-generated images or videos that can be misleading or harmful.

You can help by keeping regular, open conversations with your child about what they are doing online. Ask them about their favourite apps and games, and encourage them to share anything that makes them feel uncomfortable. Check privacy settings together and remind them never to share personal information or photos with people they don't know in real life.

The holiday season often means more online activity. Please set healthy boundaries around screen time and device use, particularly at night. And remember: if you are worried about your child's online activity, the school safeguarding team is always available to provide support and advice.


Student Success
