

The Importance of School Attendance - Especially during Winter

As we are in the colder months, it's natural to see seasonal coughs, colds and other minor illnesses circulating. However, it's more important than ever that children continue to attend school regularly to prevent missing learning, the social interaction that they receive through schooling and for their self-confidence. Good attendance is one of the strongest predictors of academic success, personal confidence and long-term wellbeing. Every day in school matters.

When children miss lessons, even for seemingly small reasons, the impact can build quickly. Routine, relationships and learning are disrupted, making it harder for students to keep up with new content and maintain friendships. Research shows that pupils who are frequently absent fall behind, which can affect their progress in every subject and reduce future opportunities.

We fully understand that children will occasionally feel unwell, and there will be times when staying at home is the right decision. However, many common winter ailments such as colds, sniffles, or mild sore throats, can be managed in school. If your child is well enough to be out of bed, eat, drink, and take part in everyday activities, they are usually well enough to attend school. If this changes throughout the school day, we will be in touch.

Our staff are here to support students and ensure that they feel safe and cared for throughout the school day. If your child requires medication or has specific needs during recovery, please contact us, we are always happy to help.

Together, we can make sure every child benefits from the learning, friendships, and opportunities that school provides every single day. Thank you for your continued partnership in making attendance a priority this winter. The first port of call for any worries or concerns will always be your child's tutor, whom they see every day.


